REGULAR DELIVERY OF SSCF SERVICES

Our team is here to help you navigate this new journey. While COVID-19 has taken us by surprise, we are ever attentive to our regular business practices and are continuing to address both competitive and community granting in the usual manner. Our staff continues to work with fund advisors and grantees to deliver services.

With your support, we are adjusting some timelines for grantees, redirecting project funds based on discussions and having general conversations on delivery of projects. Charities are grateful for the flexibility and quick response by donors during this granting period. We are happy to say that more than 60 grants have gone out the door across the province and Canada as requested by donors and through the competitive granting process since January.

EMERGENCY RESPONSE FUND FOR COMMUNITY NEEDS

If ever there was a time that help is needed in our community, it is now. In times of trouble, a Foundation like ours has the ability to support and help communities in need. By a gift from the Estate from a founding member, the Board of Directors made a very quick and responsive decision to help with immediate needs and match all donations up to \$500,000.

Our donors, business community and friends of the Foundation have stepped up immensely in the last three weeks and provided over \$250,000 to help our most vulnerable members right across south Saskatchewan. With SSCF matching those funds, we are able to initially provide more than \$500,000 directly back into emerging community needs to 17 organizations right across southern Saskatchewan.

This Emergency Fund for Community Needs is a plea to help community, and without a doubt, the community has stepped up. This money is for eminent needs in food security, shelter relief, children's needs and the needs of our most vulnerable where other funds are unavailable. Our community committee adjudicators had a difficult time choosing the first 17 recipients and there are many more applications that require funding.
